Sunbury Nursing Homes is a long established, family run care home based in historic Sunbury-on-Thames in Middlesex, UK. We are fortunate to be located opposite a beautiful stretch of the River Thames. There are several waterside pubs and restaurants just a short distance away as is the tranquil Walled Garden and visitor centre which is home to the fascinating Millennium tapestry.

We admitted our first resident nearly 90 years ago on 2nd October 1932 and ever since that time the home has been owned and managed by members of the White family. This family involvement supported by our highly experienced and dedicated 'extended family' of nursing and ancillary staff is the cornerstone on which our reputation for providing top quality care is built.



The home is registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC) to provide nursing care for older people including those living with dementia. We are regularly inspected by CQC so that you can be sure that the standards you expect are being met.

Our Facilities

The home consists of two residential buildings, The Main Building and Weir House, as well as some smaller buildings used for administration, staff training, workshops and laundry all set within some beautiful garden space.



Currently, only the Main Building is used for resident accommodation with Weir House being used for activities, training, catering and other administrative purposes.

The Main Building sits within its very attractive front and rear garden and comprises West Lodge, a Grade 2 Listed Building, built in the 18th century

linked to buildings purpose-built in 1963 and 1965. At present it has 52 single rooms and 1 two-bed shared room and is divided into 5 "wings" with between 11 and 14 residents accommodated in each wing.



The spacious Conservatory, overlooking the front gardens, together with its adjacent day room and 'The Bistro' dining room is the focal point of the daily activities programme, although full use is made of the gardens whenever the weather permits.

As well as this ground floor area, there are further lounge areas on the first floor in the Norman Wing overlooking the

front gardens and the Montford Lounge in the Johanna Wing, with a particularly fine view of the River Thames, while the second floor Storrington Lounge also has a lovely outlook over the front gardens to the river.

The bedrooms are tastefully decorated and fully furnished. However, residents are most welcome to have as many personal possessions as space will allow and to replace provided furnishings with their own to create a "home from home".

All rooms have electric, height adjustable profiling beds, overhead hoist systems and nurse call to ensure a safe environment at all times. There is Wi-Fi internet connection accessible in each room.

There is great amount of natural light coming in to all the rooms giving the home a bright and easy feel and the rooms have pleasant views of the gardens and all its associated activity.



Our Nursing Care

Full day and night nursing care is provided under direct supervision of fully qualified nursing staff in accordance with an individual care plan. This process starts with a pre admission visit to the prospective resident from our Registered Manager.



Residents are encouraged to contribute to the care plan by providing information on their social history, interests, likes and dislikes. When the resident is unable to provide the information themselves we encourage the person's relatives or friends to give us as much information as possible. The resident's individual needs are constantly monitored and care plans are reviewed and updated on a regular basis.

The trained nurses are also supported by a weekly visit from the homes' contracted GP, who will review the medical needs of the residents as appropriate. The nursing team is also complemented by the care assistants, who help carry out the planned care. Many of the Care Assistants are NVQ trained and qualified then becoming Senior Carers. The Senior Carers are assigned to specific departments of the home to ensure a

continuity of care and enable residents to receive the best possible care.

We are also very proud that all of the staff are fully employed by Sunbury Nursing Homes Ltd and we have never had to use any agency staff, which also ensures the highest possible level of daily care. Without a doubt, our biggest asset is our staff.

Social Care and Activities

We endeavour to make the routine of daily living as flexible as possible by providing a varied program of events and group activities. For example, we have a coffee and book club, card games, exercise sessions, knitting and sewing, flower arranging, cooking and baking, film and music afternoons. Special occasions and



events such as Royal Celebrations, Valentine's Day, Halloween, Christmas are all



celebrated together and we have a fireworks display in November, which is always popular. Summer often sees a beach party in the gardens. In fact whatever time of the year, we're looking for a reason to enjoy and celebrate life. Residents who prefer not to join in group activities are not forgotten and the care staff in each department offer support and provide individual activities whenever possible.

Our Activity Team prepare weekly schedules with planned activities, which take place either in the Conservatory or Weir House Drawing Room. Smaller group sessions take place in some of the other lounges. Birthdays and anniversaries are always celebrated in accordance with individual's preferences and normally complemented with a homemade cake from our Catering Team.

There are no restrictive visiting times and residents are free to choose to entertain visitors in their own rooms or in one of the lounges or the gardens. If required, one of the lounges can be booked for celebrating special occasions with friends and family.

In previous years we have entered the National Association for Provider of Activities (NAPA) challenge and been highly commended in this national competition for 2012's Olympic themed 'Going for Gold', 2011's 'Food, Glorious Food' and the previous year's Music in the Air'.





We also have links with local schools, colleges and clubs, which have led to such varied events as camp fire songs from a Beavers group, concerts to celebrate the Harvest Festival, Summer and Christmas, swing and jazz concerts inside and out in the gardens, Irish dancing displays and even Shakespearean drama. All of these community events bring great rewards to the performers and the audience and become great talking points.

The home also has Wi-Fi connection throughout.

Our activities schedule is so varied that we have separate publications such as "A Year at Sunbury Nursing Homes" to highlight this important part of our service.

Viewing the home

We trust that you have found our brochure informative. However, the only way to judge a nursing home is to see it in action. This will give you a feel of the place and its people. When you visit, you will have the opportunity to discuss the nursing needs required fully with our Registered Manager or one of the Nurse Managers and any financial or



administrative matters with one of the four family directors. During your visit, you will be given a full tour of the home and you will be able to talk to our residents and staff about the service we provide and we trust that by the end you will be reassured as to the level of care and service that we provide.

Although you are most welcome to view at any

Fees & Finances

(With effect from 1st April 2023 through to 31st March 2024)

Our fees for standard single rooms are £1350 per week.

Fees for Superior Sized Single Rooms range from £1,455 to £1,550 per week.

Before anyone can be admitted, we must undertake a care needs assessment, to ensure that we are able to meet the person's care needs, and the funding arrangements must be clearly identified.

Financing any nursing home care is very expensive and can be complicated and we would recommend that you seek the services of an Independent Financial Adviser to assist you in this process.

Where to find us


We are situated in Lower Sunbury at the western end of Thames Street between the junctions of Halliford Road and Green Street.

by Public Transport:

The nearest mainline train station is Sunbury, which is approximately a mile away. This is serviced by half hourly trains to and from Waterloo and also Shepperton. There are frequent buses from near the train station and the Home is also well served by the following bus routes:

Both St Mary's Church and the Three Fishes bus stops are within 200 yards of the Home.
